Be prepared for flash floods with these handy tips to help you stay safe.

Motorists



Avoid driving through a flooded area above road kerb height or when the road markings are no longer visible.



Drive slowly through unavoidable areas that are assessed to be passable. Avoid braking to keep engine speed higher and constant.



Stay close to the middle lane as water tends to accumulate on the side lanes.



Go through floodwater one vehicle at a time.



Upon exiting a flood, gently tap on brakes to dry them. Test them before driving off.



Do not restart a stalled vehicle. Turn on hazard light, call for assistance and move to higher ground.

Residents, Business & Building Owners



Ensure drainage systems within your compound are well-maintained and choke-free.



Ensure that flood barriers are in good working condition.



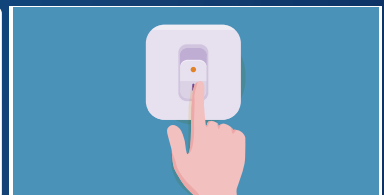
Install flood barriers when there is a risk of flood to protect your property from the rising water level.



Move essential items to higher ground.

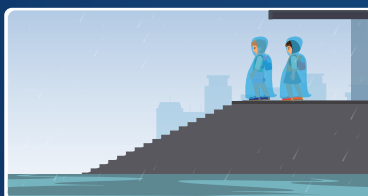


Do not touch electric switches or appliances if you are wet or standing in water.



If you need to evacuate, turn off all main switches and disconnect electrical.

Pedestrians



Avoid flooded areas and stay on higher ground.



Use a stick or umbrella to check for open drains and firmness of the ground.



Do not walk through a flooded area higher than your ankles.
