

WATER CONSERVATI



Singapore's current water usage of 430 million gallons a day is expected to almost double by 2060.

In order for future generations to eniov clean water at the turn of a tap, we need to manage the demand and usage of water wisely.

You can help conserve our precious water resource by adopting the following measures:

Sign up for the Water Efficient Building (WEB) Certification Programme

The WEB certification programme encourages building owners to implement water efficiency measures. Obtain the WEB Certification by installing water efficient fittings and adopting water efficient flow rates and flush volumes.

Recycle water

Reuse condensate from air-conditioning systems for non-potable uses e.g. irrigation, cooling towers, etc



Treat and recycle greywater (i.e. shower water discharge, wash basins and laundry) for non-potable purposes* such as toilet flushing, general washing, irrigation and cooling towers.

Collect rainwater for non-potable uses.

Use water efficient fittings

Adopt fittings with a minimum 2-tick rating under the Mandatory Water Efficiency Labelling Scheme (MWELS)

Consider using water efficient commercial dishwashers, washer extractors or high-pressure washers certified to enjoy at least 4% of water savings per year.



Ensure faulty pipes and leaks are reported promptly



Clearly display contact information for the maintenance office so that users can immediately report leaks or faulty taps, urinals, flushing cisterns and pipes in toilets.
